### JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS MISSISSIPPI COUNTY QUORUM COURT February 22, 2022

The Quorum Court of Mississippi County, Arkansas, met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. in the Circuit Courtroom of the Osceola Courthouse with County Judge John Alan Nelson presiding. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Justice Neil Burge gave the invocation.

The following members answered roll call:

Absent: Justices Fleeman, Jackson and Mangat. Also in attendance was County Attorney Jacob Holmes.

Justice White moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes as copies had been provided to the members. Justice Ash seconded the motion and the voice vote was unanimous.

In the treasurer's report, County Treasurer Peggy Meatte reported the interest rate at 1<sup>st</sup> National Bank in Osceola was .55% on \$100,000.00 for one year. She reported the sales tax revenue was up higher than it has been for the month of January in the past ten years. She also stated county general funds were in great shape.

### Committee Reports:

American Rescue Plan Committee: Justice McClanahan reported the committee met on January 26, 2022. Mayor Lee Charles Brown of Luxora was present to ask for assistance from the county to help with the cost of replacing the city's water system. Also discussed:

- The county being able to claim up \$10,000,000.00 as loss of revenue.
- Hiring a consultant. After some discussion, the committee decided to forego hiring one at this time.
- Rules on moving funds from the American Rescue Fund to the Revenue Replacement Fund. Committee vote unanimously to move all the funds.
- The cost of upgrading the health units may not cost as much as previously thought.
- Ten additional cars for the sheriff's department.

Fire, Police and Safety Committee: Justice Ash reported the committee met on February 2, 2022 with Pafford Ambulance Service. Justice Ash passed out a breakdown of runs made by Pafford in Mississippi County and response times for the last three years. Response time to the south end of the county was still a concern. County Attorney Jake Holmes had concerns regarding the

contract with Pafford. The county would not buy a county ambulance at this time but move forward with developing a County First Responder Program.

Finance Committee: Justice White reported the committee met on February 14, 2022. Topics of discussion were:

- Appropriation of \$26,373.00 from 911 fund for the Wayne Reynolds new 911 vehicle.
- Auditors-asked the county to make a procedural change in the way the county handled the budgets for the library and the hospital. The committee voted to add revenue and expenditures for both funds. The motion was made and passed to add the line item budget for revenues and expenditure and to appropriate said funds.
- Updating 2022 Budget to reflect payments for construction fund and Economic Development funds that had been paid.
- County Extension Budget line items added back to budget. \$930.00.
- Continued rental of office space for the Circuit Clerk's office (\$1,125.00 per month).
- Unpaid insurance claims. Balance owed is \$33, 000.00.
- Ten additional cars for the sheriff's department.
- New email accounts
- Hiring a state lobbyist
- Bird problems at the Osceola Courthouse
- Medicare reimbursements
- Leachville's storm damage debris at the landfill.

#### Planning and Development Committee: Justice White reported the committee

- Majestic Steel; sales tax relief; approximately 240 jobs

Decorative copper entry on west side had been installed. Wooden entry doors had not been installed. Interior signage had not been installed. No punch list had been done.
- 3. Judge Nelson and Aaron Ruby were working on finding a reasonable solution for the bird problem in Osceola. No appropriation needed at this time.
- 4. Health Department update. The Blytheville and Osceola Units were built in the 90's. Grant was received for \$250,000.00 for both units. Justice Jackson asked for a recommendation to send to the American Rescue Plan Committee. Motion was made by Justice Rick Ash to send to the American Rescue Plan Committee. Second was made by Justice Betty Hepler. Motion passed.
- 5. Farm land. Vendors were going to be contacted and the survey sent back for drawings to be changed to reflect roads and burms.

# AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN COMMITTEE MARCH 11, 2022 2:30 ANNEX BUILDING.

- 1. Meeting was called to order by Justice Molly Jackson. Information was handed out for the health units, courthouse and City of Dell.
- 2. City of Dell applied for a grant to help with drainage. Grant was awarded for \$230,000.00. The grant didn't cover all expenses. Low bid \$301,000.00. Difference of \$71,000.00. Scope of the work had been reduced and added more money from the City general account. \$53,000.00 short. City of Dell requested help completing the project. Justice Jackson stated this project would fall under the rescue money and was good use of it. Justice McDonald asked if a cap would be set for amounts the County would give. Mullenix Firm asked if the County had money for matching grants. Motion was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan to grant the City of Dell \$53,000.00 out of the Revenue Replacement Funds. Second was made by Justice Cecil McDonald. Motion passed and moved to Finance.
- 3. Health Department. Aaron Ruby sent an overall price on renovating the health units. \$2.8 million cost. Energy & Property Committee recommended buildings be repaired. Labs, refrigeration, HVAC were in need of repair. Funded at 40% would be \$1.1 million plus \$250,000.00. Motion was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan to send to Finance to set aside \$1.2 million for the county health units project from the Revenue Replacement Fund. Second was made by Justice Harbans Mangat. Motion passed.
- 4. Osceola Courthouse. HVAC, water, boiler system, ceiling in courtroom needed to be updated first. Storm drain was cleaned regularly to keep it from flooding. HVAC was around \$1 million. \$100,000.00 to update water. Justice McClanahan thought \$1.5 million. Justice McDonald thought \$2 million. Motion was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan to commit at least \$1.5 million to the Osceola Courthouse project from the revenue replacement fund. Second was made by Justice Harbans Mangat. Motion passed.
- 5. Sheriff's patrol cars. Justice Jackson thought for reporting it would be better to buy all the cars from the revenue replacement fund. \$650,000.00. Motion was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan to appropriate to purchase 18 cars and equipment out of the revenue replacement funds. Amount decided at a later date. Second was made by Justice Harbans Mangat. Motion passed.
- 6. Justice Burge stated the Senior Citizens center needed to be considered. Federal and State lobbyist had been hired.

- 7. Peggy Meatte thought a consultant was needed to help with the reporting to make sure how the rescue money was spent. Professional services were needed. Cost of consultant could come from revenue replacement fund. First report due in May. Committee recommended to send the RFQ's. Tom Henry would send the RFQ to the papers.
- 8. Insurance. Justice McDonald asked for an update on unpaid insurance claims. Justice McDonald asked if another Chairman could be elected. Kelli Jones needed more money appropriated to reimburse claims that employees had paid. Performance Health was not making any payments at this time. Contract was sent and changes were made and sent back to Mr. Nichols. Judge Nelson thought another zoom meeting was needed with Mr. Nichols. Kelli Jones thought there was a lot that hadn't been paid. Around \$160,000.00 in claims had been paid. Another insurance meeting was needed. Tom Henry was asked to set up a meeting with Dave Nichols.

- 2. Landfill accounts receivable. There were several accounts past due. Bills were due within 30 days. The landfill was concerned about the contractors. Amend Resolution 2003-9 and start enforcing. Justice Burge proposed on billing to be due in 30 days, end of 60 days send a letter notifying past due, end of 90 days vendor would not be allowed to use the landfill. Justice McClanahan thought cash should not be referenced. Landfill did not have the ability to accept credit cards. Motion was made by Justice Reggie Cullom to amend the Resolution. Second was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan. Motion passed.
- 3. Auditors said there was a process to be able to take old delinquent accounts off the books. Justice Burge would follow up with Peggy Meatte on the process. Judge Nelson thought the amended Resolution was a good idea to have a plan in place.
- 4. Judge Nelson asked about the \$500,000.00 CD. Would be used on closure or construction. Cash on hand \$1,002,654.68. Judge Nelson looked to put another half million into the CD's. \$500,000.00 left for operating expenses.

- 1. Meeting was called to order by Justice Michael White. Month of February ended in good shape. Kelli Jones was working on the clean up budget. Presented in the Quorum Court meeting. Fund Balances end of February. County General \$1,404,825.00. CD fund \$6,930,428.00. \$3.9 million in revenue replacement fund. \$3.1 million County Roads. \$7.8 million Economic Development Fund. \$5.3 million Economic Development checking. Appropriation Ordinance passed last month \$3 million for the Work Here-Live Here program. Judge Nelson, Michael White, Clif Chitwood, Brad Harrison, Randy Scott met with the Friday Firm. Shep Russell advised the County to restructure and repeal the Appropriation Ordinance. Legal description of Economic Development was restrictive. Work Here Live Here program was going to be restructured for a new 5014C non taxable entity. County money would be appropriated to industries participating in the program. Motion was made by Justice Neil Burge to repeal the Appropriation Ordinance O-2022-11. Second was made by Justice Harbans Mangat. Motion passed.
- 2. Cash in Lieu of Benefits. Medicare reimbursement program. Kelli Jones had not heard from Jacob Holmes. Money had been appropriated for the payments thru April. Kelli would get the numbers on how much was being spent for taxes, retirement, social security. 10 employees were participating in the program.
- 3. Tom Henry had nothing new on the e-mail costs.
- 4. Sheriff's Cars. American Rescue Plan Committee recommended to purchase all 18 cars with the revenue replacement funds. Cars would be able to be tracked. \$650,000.00. Justice Ash said this would get all cars under 100,000.00 miles. Started the year with 60 vehicles. End up with 51 vehicles. County provided SRO with a vehicle. SRO salary paid for by Federal Grant. Motion was made by Justice Reggie Cullom to purchase 18 cars for \$650,000.00 with revenue replacement funds. Second was made by Justice Molly Jackson. Motion passed.
