#### JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS MISSISSIPPI COUNTY QUORUM COURT May 24, 2022

The Quorum Court of Mississippi County, Arkansas, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m. in the Circuit Courtroom of the Osceola Courthouse with County Judge John Alan Nelson presiding. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Ryan Spurlock from 1st Methodist in Osceola gave the invocation.

Absent: Justice Cullom. Also in attendance was County Attorney Jacob Holmes.

Justice White moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes as copies had been provided to the members. Justice Ash seconded the motion and the voice vote was unanimous.

The Judge John Nelson introduced Ethan Brown, staff chair of the Co-Operative Extension Service; Dr. Pam Pruett, Family and Consumer Sciences agent; Kamella Neeley, county's 4-H agent and allowed them to address the court. They gave a presentation on the services offered through the co-operative extension office.

In the treasurer's report, County Treasurer Peggy Meatte reported the interest rate at 1<sup>st</sup> National Bank in Osceola was .55% on \$100,000.00 for one year. She reported the sales tax revenue was down a bit for the month of April but still one the highest in recent years. She also stated county general funds were in good shape.

#### Committee Reports:

Sanitation & Solid Waste: Justice Burge reported the committee met on May 4, 2022. He stated the landfill was doing well and was well within their budget. They had transferred \$500,000.00 to a CD which at the end of March had a balance of \$1,000,000.00. He also reported the landfill has \$573,823.69 in cash. Justice Burge informed the court they were continuing to work on being able to process bank cards and credit cards. They will also be working on direct deposit.

*Insurance Committee:* Justice Jackson reported the committee met on May 4, 2022 with Dave Nichols via zoom. Topic of discussion was trying to get all unpaid claims paid.

Finance Committee: Justice White reported the committee met on May 16, 2022 and topics of discussion were:

- NET Proposal for updating the telephone system in the Osceola Courthouse. Cost of the update is \$4,432.00.
- Landscaping proposal for the Blytheville Courthouse. The committee accepted a bid from Drew Bevill Lawncare in the amount of \$13,066.64 annually.
- The appropriation of \$15,000.00 from the Revenue Replacement Fund for work done on the Health Department Project.
- Legal fees for the "Work Here, Live Here" program in the amount of \$19,000.00 which would be taken from the Economic Development Fund.

- Appropriation for the reimbursement of Medicare payments.
- All offices and departments were still within their budget.
- \$5,000.00 appropriated for certified law enforcement officers in the state.
- JESAP job descriptions should be turned in by June 1, 2022.

The clerk read a resolution titled: A RESOLUTION ACKNOWLEDGING THE MISSISSIPPI COUNTY GOVERNMENT'S SPONSORSHIP OF EAST ARKANSAS AGENCY ON AGING'S MISSISSIPPI SENIOR CITIZENS PROGRAM. Following the reading, Justice White moved to adopt, Justice McClanahan seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Fleeman Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan, McDonald and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- Cullom. R-2022-11 was adopted by the court.

Following the second reading by title only, Justice Ash moved to suspend the rules and proceed to the third reading by title only, Justice Burge seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Fleeman Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan, McDonald and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- Cullom. Following the third reading by title only, Justice Ash moved to adopt, Justice Hepler seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Fleeman Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan, McDonald and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- Cullom. O-2022-29 was adopted by the court.

The clerk was asked to read an ordinance titled: AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING APPROPRIATIONS IN ORDER TO PAY INVOICES SUBMITTED BY ARCHITECT FOR COUNTY HEALTH UNIT IMPROVED PROJECT. Following the reading, Justice White moved to adopt, Justice Hepler seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Fleeman Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan, McDonald and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- Cullom. O-2022-30 was adopted by the court.

O-2022-31 was failed on the floor by a vote of six to four.

The clerk was asked to read an ordinance titled: AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE MISSISSIPPI COUNTY GOVERNMENT, INCLUDING EXTRA

COMPENSATION PAYMENTS TO REPLACE DISCONTINUED HRA ACCOUNTS. Following the reading, Justice Jackson moved to amend the wording by adding the month of July, Justice McClanahan seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Fleeman Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan, McDonald and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- Cullom. After the vote on amending, Justice White moved to adopt, Justice McClanahan seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Fleeman Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan, McDonald and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- Cullom. O-2022-32 was adopted by the court.

#### ROAD & BRIDGES COMMITTEE MEETING JUNE 1, 2022 1:30 ANNEX BUILDING

ATTENDANCE: Chairman Justice Rick Ash; Justice Joe Lewis; Justice Molly Jackson; Justice Betty Hepler; Justice Cecil McDonald; Justice Tobye McClanahan; Justice Harbans Mangat; Judge John Alan Nelson; Public Affairs Tom Henry; NEA Town Courier Revis Blaylock.

- 1. Meeting was called to order by Justice Rick Ash. Justice Ash turned the meeting over to Judge Nelson for an update on roads and bridges.
- 2. Judge Nelson said things were going well. The department was behind from the excessive rainfalls. At this time 54 tons of cold mix had been applied to the asphalt roadways. 22 ditches had been cleaned out, replaced 16 culverts, 1,020 loads of slag had been put out, stockpiling red clay gravel. 1300 total would be stockpiled. Road project started with 3 inch overlay with State funds on Byrum Road. Bridge project with ARDOT in the Half Moon area. Excess of \$1 million. Interstate 55 being repaired from Blytheville to the Burdette exit. Judge Nelson met with ARDOT at least once a week. Mack trucks had been replaced with Western Star. Purchased a larger front end loader. During the ice and snow the road department restarted their deicing program. Road department made their own deicer to apply the liquid salt and a vat for the solution to be put in. Annual work behind the levee to repair roads that were eroded from the flooding from the river. Worked with the City of Manila on a paving project to put asphalt on two gravel roads. Ditches had been cleaned around the schools to help with the flooding. Hwy. 119 had been taken over from the State on the property of U.S. Steel. Work was being done to better accommodate semi trucks. Bid for the property across from Love's was being worked on. Minimum bid of \$400,000.00. Graders were running when dry and doing a great job. Overpasses were in bad shape.
- 3. Justice McClanahan asked if lighting in Armorel could be mentioned to ARDOT. Judge Nelson had talked to ARDOT. The County could sponsor lighting. Permit would be needed from ARDOT before installing. Illumination could be put up to alert traffic there was an intersection or illuminated like it was daylight. ARDOT thought travelers got thru it well and unless a lot of accidents didn't need to be addressed at this time.
- 4. The County had two trailer trucks that had a system built into the cab and dumps the gravel and does not require any work from the grader. GPS systems were in place and new ones had to be installed in the new dump trucks.
- 5. John Deere 300 horse power tractor at the landfill was near the end of the lease. 1000 hours, 3 years old. The buy out was \$171, 053.00. The landfill was going to purchase the tractor. Justice McClanahan asked if there was damage from the fire at the landfill. The City of Dell had given the landfill a firetruck. Material was found that should not have been put in the landfill. Possibly lime.
- 6. Justice Ash asked if the work on the 23 bridges had been started. Court orders had been served on some landowners to get the right of way. Justice McDonald asked what could be

done with trucks parking on the side of the road causing pot holes. Judge Nelson thought the highway needed to be extended on Hwy. 61 around Lowe's. Salt applied to the road didn't cause the pot holes but water when it got in the cracks and freezes and breaks the road up. County had an Ordinance in place for requirements for county roads.

- 3. Job Description were sent to the Personnel Committee for the Juvenile Department. The senior Judge for the Juvenile Committee and the supervisor for the Juvenile officer had not seen the descriptions and would be forwarded to them and would get a recommendation from them. Justice Ash recommended the request to be tabled. Motion was made by Justice Harbans to table the request. Second was made by Justice Betty Hepler. Motion passed.
- 4. Discussed last year was looking into a longevity package for the County employees. Elected officials not included. \$100.00 per year for each year employed. Maximum of 20 years. Capped at \$2,000.00. Separated the newest persons hired. The committee would discuss the recommendation at the next meeting.
- 5. Meeting was turned over to Justice Cecil McDonald. Justice McDonald wanted to see the County celebrate Juneteenth Independence Day and would show great progress. Juneteenth became a Federal Holiday on June 18, 2021. Governor Hutchinson declared it a State Memorial Day. Judge Nelson could declare any day a holiday. County recognized 12 holidays. Juneteenth was the day slavery was abolished. Committee supported the request. Court was scheduled in advance and the county could not change court dates. Judge Nelson suggested Friday the 17<sup>th</sup> this year because of court schedules. Proclamation was finished and was read by Judge Nelson. Motion was made by Justice McDonald that Juneteenth become an annual celebration for Mississippi County. Second was made by Justice Betty Hepler. Holiday would be celebrated in the future by the Federal date. Motion passed. Resolution would be needed to amend the personnel policy procedure.
- 6. Justice Ash recommended when the Courthouse opened the next Quorum Court meeting be held in the Blytheville Courthouse.

#### Finance Committee Meeting June 20, 2022 1:30 Annex Building

- 1. Meeting was called to order by Justice Michael White. Overview of monthly expenses. May 31<sup>st</sup> 42% of the year. Justice White said the new reports were in one system. Road Department 49%, Landfill 50% (operating 39.35%), Sr. Citizens 39%, Co. Jail 37%, County Clerk 34%. Fund balances. ¾ million in county general, 6.9 million CD, 3.85 million revenue replacement fund and second check had been received for 3.9 million, Economic Development \$3 1/2 million checking, \$7.8 million CD fund, \$1.9 million Blytheville courthouse fund, \$48,000.00 Osceola courthouse. Bird project to come out of the \$48,000.00.
- 2. Employees were encouraged to participate in the COVID vaccination program. Incentive was offered for the employees to get vaccinated. Kelli Jones wanted to close the program. Only two employees had requested the program this year. Money was appropriated for all employees to be vaccinated. Ordinance needed to be amended to close the program. No action at this time and employees would be notified that the program may be closed.
- 3. Publishing costs had reached the amount appropriated. Fuel costs had gone up for the landfill, road department and Sheriff's department.
- 4. Circuit Clerk's rent. Justice Jackson thought the rent should be appropriated until the end of the year. Storage was needed when moved back to the courthouse. The courthouse had a certificate of occupancy. Judge Nelson had the punch list and copy had been e-mailed to CNI.
- 5. Veterans office. Dale Dickerson had requested new equipment. Mr. Dickerson had met all certifications. Total request. \$2,500.00 estimated. Justice White recommended \$3,000.00. Motion was made by Justice Molly Jackson to appropriate \$3,000.00 for the equipment in the Veteran's office. Second was made by Justice Neil Burge. Motion passed.
- 6. Judge's Office. The Judge requested new computers (3) and monitors (2). \$1,199.00 each computer, \$375.00 each monitor. Total \$4,347.00. Justice White recommended \$4,500.00. Printer was not needed at this time. Motion was made by Justice Neil Burge to appropriate \$4,500.00 for the computers and monitors in the Judge's office. Second was made by Justice Molly Jackson. Motion passed.
- 7. Public Defender's rent. Letter was received from Frank Iacampo. Mr. Bradley paid \$300.00 per month rent. Mr. Iacampo would like to raise the rent to \$400.00 per month. The committee supported the increase. Motion was made by Justice Molly Jackson to accept the

increase for Mr. Bradley's rent to \$400.00. Second was made by Justice Neil Burge. Motion passed.

- 8. Land leveling. Survey was finished. Figure could be given and appropriated or wait until numbers were received. Justice White said Judge Nelson should be given authority to award the contract and fund later. Motion was made by Justice Reggie Cullom to support the Judge awarding the contract and funding later. Second was made by Justice Molly Jackson. Motion passed.
- 9. Microphone. A larger microphone was needed to be able to cover the meetings. Comments had been received that the audio was not loud enough. No estimate at this time. Justice White thought the upgrade was needed. More research would be done.
- 10. Nucor called Justice White about the bicycle paths and asked if anything been done. ARDOT was contacted about the paths and signage. Justice McDonald had e-mailed Judge Nelson about signage for bicycle safety. Permission had to be given from ARDOT to place signs. Road department would fund the signs.
- 11. Juvenile Department. Administrative Office of Courts had awarded Mississippi County \$30,000.00 for FY2022 Supplemental Juvenile Funding. Grant from AOC to give hazardous duty/retention bonus checks to each employee in our 6 counties. All employed since March 2022 receive \$5,000.00, between April 2020 and July 2021 receive \$2,500.00, employed after July 1, 2021 receive \$1,000.00. Kelli Jones would check to see if taxes would be held out. The Sheriff's department received the entire amount. Justice Burge asked if this was a one time payment not a salary increase. Motion was made by Justice Molly Jackson to move the request to the full court. Second was made by Justice Neil Burge. Motion passed.
- 12. Money had been appropriated for Federal and State lobbyists. Aeroplex and Blytheville Regional Airport Authority had made a request for a fire truck. The fire truck on the Aeroplex was a 1980 model and not reliable. A letter was submitted by Senator Boozman, Senator Tom Cotton and Congressman Rick Crawford to a Colonel at the Pentagon to receive a surplus military fire truck to continue training for U.S. Airforce. The Aeroplex trains touch & go landings, takeoffs, air drop, drop zone training, loading and unloading of cargo, new pilot training, night vision goggles and assault zone training. The airport had hosted Air Force One. The loss of the 1980 firetruck had restricted these activities. Weekly meetings were held with the lobbyists. All benchmarks had been met up to now. Second revenue replacement had been received. Almost \$4 million.
- 13. Justice White would like to help small communities with infrastructure. P & D meeting Thursday June 23, at 1:00 p.m. Annex building. One commitment from an industry had been made. Infrastructure was needed before new homes could be built. Energy & Property Committee would explore the possibilities. Judge Nelson said State lobbyists were working with cities in the county to assist with their infrastructure. Currently working with Manila, Burdette, Keiser and Luxora. Meeting was scheduled with the Mullinex firm tomorrow at 10:00 about this issue. Federal grant going thru the Natural Resource Commission was a cost share. County might want to use some ARP money for the seed.

- 14. Janice Currie wanted to set a meeting with Mike Patty to demonstrate how the older books were repaired. The meeting was scheduled for July 7, 2022 at 1:30. Annex building.
- 15. First reporting for the ARP money had been done. The reporting went well.
- 16. Landfill received \$54,155.10 from Will Allen.
- 17. CAS would work on the Medicare benefits. Cost around \$500.00 to \$1,000.00.

- 1. Meeting was called to order by Justice Michael White. Justice White turned the meeting over to Clif Chitwood.
- 2. Mr. Chitwood presented a recommendation for Chime Solutions an Atlanta based company owned by Mark Wilson who was an African American business man. Dunn and Bradstreet gave Mr. Wilson a \$25,000.00 contract. Built into a multi million dollar call center. Seven years ago he started Chime Solutions. Located in Dallas, Atlanta and Charleston. Mr. Wilson would like to bring to Blytheville a service center dedicated to Cigna Insurance. Training would last eight weeks, 40 hours a week. Company was not asking for incentive money but were asking to train our people and pay them while being trained. Request for \$1,991,531.00 to train 150 people over the eight week period. To be hired by Chime you had to pass an aptitude test, drug screening, Cigna would begin the eight weeks of training. State was interested in helping and Mr. Chitwood was expecting between \$500,000.00 and \$800,000.00 and would come off the \$1,991,531.00. Training would be thru Payroll started after pre- employment training. Gene Bennett addressed the committee. \$360,000.00 for Cigna training, \$81,250.00 for pre- employment training, \$82,031.00 for new hire training, management and support staff training \$9,875.00. Child care would be available. Medical, 401, retirement provided. Justice McDonald thought everyone should be employed over minimum wage. Mississippi County should not be in the bottom 10 in the nation. Justice McDonald was in support of Chime Solutions. Mayor Sanders and Mayor Wilson were also in support of Chime Solutions. Motion was made by Justice Cecil McDonald to move the recommendation to the full court to appropriate \$1,991,531.00 for Chime Solutions for training for 150 people. Second was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan. Motion passed.
- 3. Sierra Group. Request. 30 jobs//500K loan. Recommendation \$250,000.00 on loan payment. Sierra Group was expanding 30 jobs. Financing had been secured with a loan for \$500,000.00 from Southern Bancorp. The Executive Board recommended a \$250,000.00 offset payment on the \$500,000.00 loan. Loan secured would have second lien on equipment. Motion was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan to approve the request. Second was made by Justice Cecil McDonald. Motion passed.

- 4. Wheatland Tube- ATLAS Company. \$50 million investment. 60 jobs. \$25 to \$32 per hour. Recommended package of \$550K capital offset with recommendation that \$250K be contributed to Grow Mississippi County for Wheatley and Atlas employees under the WH-LH program. 200 people working when staffed. Motion was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan to support the recommendation. Second was made by Justice Cecil McDonald. Motion passed.
- 5. USS. BRS. Mr. Chitwood recommended a new Economic Development contract with BRS and USS for \$1 million in capital offsets in exchange for 100 new jobs. Motion was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan for the recommendation. Second was made by Justice Cecil McDonald. Motion passed.
- 6. Mr. Chitwood introduced Mallory Darby the new Vice President of Great River Economic Foundation.
