The Quorum Court of Mississippi County, Arkansas, met in regular session at 6:00 p.m. in the Justice Neil Burge gave the invocation, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Justice White moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes as copies had been provided to the members. Justice Ash seconded the motion and the voice vote was unanimous.

In the treasurer's report, County Treasurer Peggy Meatte reported the interest rate at Cadence Bank (formerly Bancorp South) was 3.70% on \$100,000.00 for eight months. Sales tax revenue was once again up from previous month; one of the best in the past ten years.

Committee Reports:

Planning and Development Committee: Justice White reported the committee met on December 08, 2022. Wayne Reynold, OEM was present to discuss the issue he was having getting notification of new constructions. He stressed the importance of having a registered 911 address. He also presented a sample ordinance with specified guidelines to the committee.

Justice White also reported, Dr. Shemwell had received information on all Arkansas Secondary Institutions. Five years after graduation the average salary received was \$61,342.00. Out of twenty-two, ANC was almost \$10,000.00 more than the second highest.

Finance Committee: Justice Burge reported the committee met on December 12, 2022 and topics of discussion were:

- November expenses were reviewed. Budgets continued to be in line. County in good financial standing.
- Landfill transferred \$1,500,000.00 this year.
- The county being eligible to receive \$50,000.00 this year and next year for shared federal money.
- Human Society building
- Vehicles for Senior Citizens Center
- Update on Health Departments improvements

The clerk was asked to read a resolution titles: A RESOLUTION HONORING JUSTICE FRED FLEEMAN FOR SERVICE AS A QUORUM COURT JUSTICE FROM DISTRICT NO. 1. Following the reading, Justice White moved to adopt, Justice Hepler seconded and the vote was: : Aye --- Ash, Burge, Cullom, Fleeman, Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- McDonald. R-2022-18 was adopted by the court.

The clerk was asked to read a resolution titles: A RESOLUTION HONORING JUSTICE JOE LEWIS FOR SERVICE AS A QUORUM COURT JUSTICE FROM DISTRICT NO. 7. Following the reading, Justice White moved to adopt, Justice Hepler seconded and the vote was: : Aye --- Ash, Burge, Cullom, Fleeman, Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- McDonald. R-2022-19 was adopted by the court.

The clerk was asked to read an ordinance titled: AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR TRANSACTING BUSINESS AT ALL REGULAR SESSIONS OF THE QUORUM COURT OF MISSISSIPPI COUNTY, ARKANSAS" Following the reading, Justice White moved to adopt and Justice McClanahan seconded. Before the vote, Justice White expressed the need for this ordinance to be read three times. Justice White made a motion to amend the rules and attach an emergency clause and proceed to the second reading by title only, Justice McClanahan seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Cullom, Fleeman, Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan and White; Nay ---None; Absent --- McDonald. Judge Nelson asked for a motion to amend the title of this ordinance to correct a scrivener's error. Justice White so moved, Justice McClanahan seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Cullom, Fleeman, Hepler, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- McDonald. The amended title now read as follows: AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE RATES FOR COUNTY CONSERVATION DISTRICT, ARKANSAS NORTHEASTERN COLLEGE DISTRICT, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, AND MUNICIPALITIES WITHIN THE COUNTY OF MISSISSIPPI FOR THE YEAR 2022 AND LEVYING SAID TAXES FOR COLLECTION IN THE YEAR 2023, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES". Following the third reading by title only, Justice White moved to adopt, Justice Ash seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Cullom, Fleeman, Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- McDonald. Ordinance No. O-2022-66 was adopted by the court.

The clerk was asked to read an ordinance titled: AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING SERVICE OF PUBLIC UTILITIES AND ASSIGNMENT OF ADDRESSES BY OEM". Following the reading of said ordinance, Justice Ash informed the court this ordinance also required three readings and made a motion to add an emergency clause and proceed to the second reading by title only, Justice White seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Cullom, Fleeman, Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- McDonald. Following the second reading by title only, Justice Ash made a motion to proceed to the third reading by title only, Justice Hepler seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Cullom, Fleeman, Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- McDonald. Following the third reading by title only, Justice Ash moved to adopt, Justice Hepler seconded and the vote was: Aye --- Ash, Burge, Cullom, Fleeman, Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan and White; Nay --- Ash, Burge, Cullom, Fleeman, Hepler, Jackson, Lewis, Mangat, McClanahan and White; Nay --- None; Absent --- McDonald. Ordinance No. O-2022-67 was adopted by the court.

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN MEETING DECEMBER 20, 2022 1:30 ANNEX BUILDING

- 1. Meeting was called to order by Justice Molly Jackson. Health Units were discussed. Copies of e-mails were handed out. The project had been bid several times. Base bid was \$1.9 million. Cleaning up the empty lot had been eliminated. \$66,000.00. Down to \$1.7 million. Olympus was approached to get ways to reduce the cost. No floor demo. Osceola would save \$9,000.00. Mr. Ruby did not recommend putting new floors over old tile. Solid surface counter tops replaced with laminate would save \$40,000.00. Mr. Cool offered a \$13,000.00 savings on HVAC. No resurfacing or resealing of parking lots was included in the bid.
- 2. The bid from Olympus would expire on Friday December 23rd. Justice Jackson thought another \$250,000.00 needed to be appropriated to the project. Justice Burge thought Mr. Ruby should re design the plans to get lower bids. Mr. Ruby was asked to draw new plans and re-bid the project. Motion was made by Justice Tobye McClanahan to let the bid expire. Second was made by Harbans Mangat. Motion passed.
- 3. Humane Society. Property north of the Courthouse was owned by the Humane Society. The thrift store was needed to generate income. \$50,000.00 per year. Judge Nelson thought the property across from Hardy sales could be used. Building was around 3800 square foot. New building could be built for around ¼ million. Humane Society asked for \$500,000.00 and build the building they way they wanted it. The old Blytheville Police station was also discussed for storage.
- 4. Public needed to be educated on why they needed to move to the area. An ad agency was needed to promote Mississippi County. Cost could be \$1 million per year. Moved forward to see what could be done.

Justice Ash asked if a contractor had been contacted to clean the courthouse. Complaints had been received. Judge Nelson was looking into cleaning companies.
- 14. Justice White asked about the repairs in Osceola. Justice Ash recommended the Energy & Property tour the annex building and Osceola Courthouse. Repairs were needed in both buildings. Energy & Property Committee meeting would be called.
- 15. Humane Society. \$500,000.00 was the counter offer. Land on Division was also included. The property would be used for storage and parking. The County Judge was the only one that could sign contracts. If the committee was in favor of the project it needed to be discussed with Judge Nelson. Justice Ash thought the price should be around \$350,000.00.
